ADOPTION OF BY-LAW NUMBER 200 REGARDING THE PROHIBITION OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF CERTAIN SHOPPING BAGS IN RETAIL SHOPS

WHEREAS section 19 of the Municipal Powers Act (CQLR, chapter C-47.1) allows any local municipality to adopt environmental regulations;

WHEREAS the municipal council considers that it is appropriate to regulate the distribution of certain shopping bags in retail shops on its territory;

WHEREAS a presentation of the by-law and a notice of motion was given at the regular meeting of March 5, 2018 by Councillor Anselmo Marandola;

THEREFORE, it is proposed by Councillor Donald Manconi, seconded by Councillor Alain Giroux and resolved that by-law number 200 regarding the prohibition of the distribution of certain shopping bags in retail shops be adopted as deposited.

REQUEST FOR SUPPORT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF MUNICIPAL PROGRAMS THAT ENHANCE CONSERVATION PROJECTS IN TERMS OF THE ACQUISITION, MANAGEMENT AND RESTORATION OF NATURAL ENVIRONMENTS THAT PLAY A STRATEGIC ROLE IN PRESERVING LIVING ENVIRONMENTS OF THEIR COMMUNITY

WHEREAS the Municipality of the Township of Gore is a typical rural Canadian municipality, rich and diverse in lakes, forests and wetlands;

WHEREAS vacationing is one of the strategic uses of this municipality and that this economic activity depends in particular on the ecological health of this territory;

WHEREAS the Township of Gore Council has for many years recognized the importance of protecting its natural heritage and surrounds itself with environmental professionals to develop a range of urban planning tools for this purpose;

WHEREAS this municipality of over 1,900 inhabitants has been investing for 14 years in the development of green infrastructure, specialized equipment, environmental characterization studies, public policies and strategic plans to better protect and enhance the natural environment;

WHEREAS the municipality is already participating in all the regional initiatives with a conservation focus, namely one of the first Quebec strategies for the conservation of Argenteuil's natural environment adopted at the RCM level;

WHEREAS the Township of Gore is already working on the implementation of projects that meet the main orientations of this strategy:

- Implementing connectivity of ecological corridors through various protection, enhancement and restoration tools;
- Developing urban planning tools to support local municipalities in their conservation efforts;
- Enhancing voluntary conservation projects;
- Conforming to supra-territorial and neighbouring conservation plans;
- Reviewing forest practices to incorporate conservation objectives for the natural environments of interest;

- Promoting an accessible natural network of nature parks;
- Developing interest in nature observation in communities, such as the installation of a network of nesting boxes for species found in the area.

WHEREAS on private land, a municipality wishing to preserve a natural site of interest and thus ensure the accessibility to its citizens to this common asset and its fauna and flora, has few management options and should normally consider its acquisition;

WHEREAS the municipal evaluation of a property is based on a market value calculated according to its development potential and that, given this fact, a municipality is seldom financially competitive against private interests;

WHEREAS the return on investment is calculated more easily by the short-term development of road infrastructures and buildings on a property and not by the protection of the ecological benefits that a protected natural area provides;

WHEREAS the Township of Gore notes that this conservation issue is the same in all Quebec and Canadian municipalities;

WHEREAS recent Federal and Provincial public policies are increasingly incorporating the need to protect natural environments such as wetlands;

WHEREAS scientific studies, such as those coordinated by the Ouranos group, demonstrate that natural environments are key natural infrastructures in a strategy of adaptation to climate change;

WHEREAS many economic studies, such as the one on the ecological capital of Greater Montreal, make it urgent to invest in preserving the ecological benefits provided by natural environments;

WHEREAS the Township of Gore is making great efforts to find the necessary funding to acquire certain natural environments on its territory that play a crucial role in order to manage them as natural assets or natural municipal infrastructures and thus continue the implementation of its strategic plan;

WHEREAS the efforts of this small rural municipality are not very fruitful and inefficient since the existing government funding programs hardly recognize the eligibility of this type of project and are moving towards actions to supplement the urban imperatives that wish to develop infrastructures of green engineering, decontaminate or restore degraded sites or set up alternative transport networks;

CONSEQUENTLY, it is proposed by Councillor Donald Manconi and seconded by Councillor Alain Giroux
and **RESOLVED:**

THAT the Township of Gore Council call on the governments of Quebec and Canada to implement municipal programs that enhance conservation projects in terms of the acquisition, management and restoration of natural environments that play a strategic role in preserving living environments of their community;

THAT the Township of Gore Council request the MRC d'Argenteuil, the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and the "Fédération Québécoise des Municipalités" to support it in this process;

THAT the Township of Gore Council request that the Federation of Canadian Municipalities forward this request for support to all municipal federations in all of the Canadian provinces;

THAT the Council of the Township of Gore ask the Government of Quebec to take stock of its non-essential natural assets and to encourage the acquisition of these by regional and local municipal authorities.

CONTRIBUTION FOR PARK PURPOSES FROM THE SUBDIVISION OF LOT 5 081 318

WHEREAS THAT a subdivision application bearing number 2018-1003 was filed with the municipal inspector according to the subdivision plan prepared by Robert Lessard, Land Surveyor, dated March 19th, 2018 and bearing minute number 9 256 to subdivide the lot registered in the cadaster of Québec as lot 5 081 318 into four (4) separate lots being lots 6 227 270 to 6 227 273;

FEDERATION OF CANADIAN MUNICIPALITIES ELECTION TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

WHEREAS the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) represents the interests of municipalities on policy and program matters that fall within federal jurisdiction;

WHEREAS the FCM's Board of Directors is comprised of elected municipal officials from all regions and sizes of communities to form a broad base of support and provide the FCM with the prestige required to carry the municipal message to the federal government;

MANDATE TO FRANCINE NAULT NOTARY – TRANSFER OF LOTS FOR PARK PURPOSES

WHEREAS on February 5, 2018, the Municipal Council adopted resolution 2018-02-28 to accept the transfer of lots 5 080 968, 5 081 001, 5 081 105, 5 081 377, 5 081 381, 5 081 425, 5 082,185, 5,082,188 and 5,082,189 for park purposes for the subdivision of the Lac Roger project;

CONSEQUENTLY, it is proposed by Councillor Clark Shaw and seconded by Councillor Anik Korosec that the council mandates Me Francine Nault to proceed with the title transfer of the said lots.

THAT the transfer fees be charged to the Municipality.

IT IS PROPOSED by Councillor Donald Manconi and seconded by Councillor Anik Korosec **AND RESOLVED** that:

- The municipality commits itself to respect the terms of the guide that applies to it;
- The municipality commits itself to be the sole responsible party and cannot hold Canada and Québec as well as their ministers, high ranking officials, employees and their agents responsible for any claims, requirements, losses, damages and costs of any sort for any injuries inflicted upon a person, the death of that person, damages caused to property or the loss of property attributed to a deliberate or negligent act arising directly or indirectly from investments made by way of the financial aid obtained in the TECQ program for 2014-2018;
- The municipality approves the content and authorizes sending to the Minister of municipal affairs, regions and land occupancy the work schedule attached herewith and all other documents required by the Ministry aimed at receiving the government's contribution as was confirmed in writing by the Minister of municipal affairs, regions and land occupancy;
- The municipality commits itself to achieve the minimum level of assets in municipal infrastructure established at \$28 per resident per year, being a total of \$140 per resident for the five (5) years of the program;
- The municipality commits itself to inform the Minister of municipal affairs, regions and land occupancy of all modifications which may be brought to the work schedule as approved by this resolution;
- The municipality certifies by this resolution that the attached work scheduling includes true realized costs and reflects the estimated expenditures of the eligible works until March 31st 2018.

2017 MAINTENANCE SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR THE LOCAL ROAD NETWORK

WHEREAS the Ministry of Transport paid \$ 154,221.00 for the maintenance of the local road network for the 2017 calendar year;

WHEREAS this compensation is given to the municipality for the current and preventive maintenance of local roads identified by the Ministry of Transport as 1 and 2 as well as the components of bridges located on these roads for which the municipality is responsible;

WHEREAS operating expenses excluding depreciation add up to \$ 436 284.00 and the investment expenses add up to \$ 9 106.00;

It is proposed by Councillor Alain Giroux and seconded by Councillor Anik Korosec and unanimously resolved that the municipality of the Township of Gore inform the Ministry of Transport of the way in which the compensation for the current and preventive maintenance of local roads identified by the Ministry of Transport as 1 and 2 as well as the components of bridges located on these roads for which the municipality is responsible was used according to the objectives of the maintenance support program for the local road network.

SIGNATURE OF A PRIVATE PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT WITH THE NEST BOXES NETWORK OF ARGENTEUIL (RNA)

WHEREAS these nest boxes are intended to provide nesting sites for bird species that nest in cavities such as tree swallows, wood ducks and barred owls, but which breed little or not at all in Argenteuil due to the lack of availability of such cavities;

WHEREAS the installation of nesting boxes also facilitates the observation of species and makes it possible to collect data on the use of nesting boxes and the bird's reproduction;

WHEREAS the maintenance and follow-up of all RNA nesting boxes is done once a year, usually from January to March;

WHEREAS half of the expenses under the agreement will be paid by the MRC d'Argenteuil;

WHEREAS the cost for the municipality will be \$ 350 for the installation of 15 nesting boxes on Braemar Road near the power line;

WHEREAS new nesting boxes may be installed on the territory by the municipality following the agreement.

CONSEQUENTLY it is proposed by Councillor Clark Shaw and seconded by Councillor Donald Manconi that the Municipality signs the private participation agreement with the RNA required for the installation and maintenance of nesting boxes at certain locations within its territory.
