2024-11-313 ADOPTION OF THE DIRECTIVE RELATING TO THE USE OF A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN THE OFFICIAL LANGUAGE – SPECIAL DIRECTIVE FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GORE

WHEREAS the Act respecting French, the official and common language of Québec (S.Q. 2022, c. 14), assented to on June 1, 2022, amended the Charter of the French Language (CQLR, c. C-11) (hereinafter the "Charter");

WHEREAS the Charter establishes a duty of exemplarity for the civil administration, notably requiring municipal bodies to use the French language in an exemplary manner in their activities:

WHEREAS the Language policy of the State, which came into effect on June 1, 2023, applies to municipal bodies;

WHEREAS the Regulation respecting the language of the civil administration (CQLR, c. C-11, r. 8.1) and the Regulation respecting the derogations to the duty of exemplarity of the civil administration and the documents drawn up or used in research (CQLR, c. C-11, r. 5.1) complement the legal regime applicable to the civil administration regarding the use of French and provide, in addition to those stated in the Charter, situations where a language other than French may be used;

WHEREAS, in accordance with section 29.15 of the Charter, an agency of the civil administration to which the language policy of the State applies must adopt a directive specifying the nature of situations in which it intends to use a language other than French in cases allowed by the Charter and its regulations and reviewed it at least every 5 years;

WHEREAS the Municipality of the Township of Gore is a recognized body under section 29.1 of the Charter;

WHEREAS an organization recognized under section 29.1 of the Charter may depart from the obligation to use French in an exemplary manner when, in accordance with the Charter, it uses the language that its recognition allows it to use:

WHEREAS the obligation to transmit this directive, as well as any subsequent revisions, to the Minister of the French Language in addition to making it public on the municipality/RCM/board's website;

MODIFICATION OF THE IMPOSED CONDITION REGARDING MINOR DEROGATION NO 2024-08 : 101 CASCADE ROAD, LOT 5 081 047 : RÉSOLUTION 2024-09-240

WHEREAS a minor derogation request has been filed to allow for the construction of a garage at 3.2 m from the front property line instead of at 10 m as indicated in the zoning grid for zone VI-9. WHEREAS the modest size of the paved space and the wooded area surrounding the parking areas eliminate the risk of creating a heat island;

REQUEST FOR THE REDUCTION THE SPEED LIMIT ON HIGHWAY 329, SECTION BETWEEN THE SIR JOHN LAKE BRIDGE AND DU LAC CHEVREUIL ROAD

WHEREAS in October 2024, the members of the Société des propriétaires du Domaine Lakefield submitted a motion to Council requesting the reduction of the maximum speed limit on highway 329, within the section starting from the Sir John Lake Bridge to du Lac Chevreuil Road;

WHEREAS the speed limit is 90 km/h along this section (between the north exit of the Sir John Lake Bridge and du Lac Chevreuil Road in Gore);

WHEREAS there is a significant concern for school children who take school buses, which must stop at several points along this section of highway 329, including at the entrance to Domaine Lakefield at Rainbow Street;

WHEREAS there is a curving hill along this section that is particularly dangerous for users of Rainbow Street, both coming onto and exiting Rainbow Street; the entry time for those arriving from the south on highway 329 is short and dangerous, while those going onto highway 329 face limited visibility and vehicles coming from the north at 90-100 km/h, including heavy vehicles that struggle to slow down when going downhills;

WHEREAS highway 329 is very popular with cyclists and the maximum authorized speed of 90 km/h constitutes a danger to their safety, particularly on the bridge where there is no space reserved for them, leaving them totally exposed to vehicles;

WHEREAS the incline of highway 329 at this location is 10% and requires vehicles to increase their engine speed to reach the speed limit, which considerably increases air pollution;

WHEREAS this section of highway 329 is travelled by numerous trucks transporting products from the nearby quarries and sand pits, frequently using their engine brakes;

WHEREAS this portion of highway 329 is surrounded by Sir John, Frédéric, Kenny, Echo and Dawson lakes, as well as numerous wetlands, thus amplifying the sound reverberation:

WHEREAS noise pollution is noticeable for miles around, harming the health and tranquility of the residents of Domaine Lakefield, among others;

WHEREAS the Municipality of the Township of Gore considers it important to support the request of the Société des propriétaires du Domaine Lakefield, which proposes to reduce the speed limit along highway 329 to 70 km/h along the section between the north exit of the Sir John Lake Bridge and du Lac Chevreuil Road in Gore.
