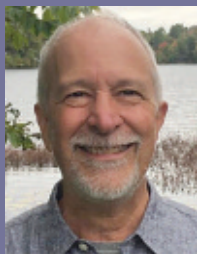

During the last election campaign, the municipal council pledged to improve services to citizens. Together with the municipal administration, we have been working to identify and implement innovative and effective solutions to fulfill this commitment.

I am very happy to share with you several major projects that will be implemented in 2026 to tangibly improve services to citizens.

First and foremost, a **new Citizen Web Portal** will be launched in the coming months. This platform is scheduled for online use within the next three months and is designed to be a modern, user-friendly tool that will allow you to:

- receive **citizen alerts** quickly and efficiently;
- apply for **permits online**;
- **view your tax account** at any time;
- submit any other **citizen request** without having to travel.

This portal represents a significant step towards a more accessible, more efficient, and better-adapted municipality.

Furthermore, significant **improvements will be made to urban planning by-laws**. These modifications aim to simplify procedures, make by-laws more understandable, and ensure the harmonious and responsible development of our territory.

In a greater commitment to **transparency and sound public financial management**, the Municipality has also purchased **new accounting software for budget monitoring**. This new tool will allow us to easily track the evolution of expenditures and revenues, which in turn facilitates the production of comprehensive reports on projects of public interest.

To foster direct and open communication with the public, a new email address has also been created to contact members of the municipal council: conseillers@cantondegore.qc.ca.

We encourage citizens to use this address to share their questions, comments, or concerns.

I would like to express my **gratitude to the municipal team**, whose proactivity, professionalism, and commitment will enable the implementation of all these improvements. Their close collaboration with the municipal council is essential to the success of these projects.

With this, the Municipality of the Township of Gore continues its commitment to providing quality, modern, and accessible services, while remaining attentive to its residents.

The council has authorized an operating budget of \$7,124,448 for the coming year. This budget will support essential services and priority projects for the municipality.

In addition, the council has authorized several specific allocations:

- \$ 80,973 will be allocated from the surplus earmarked for the Infrastructure Rehabilitation Assistance Program (PARIT);
- \$ 80,000 will come from the growth fund;
- \$ 32,782 will be drawn from the park fund to support green space initiatives.

The capital budget, dedicated to infrastructure projects and long-term investments, amounts to \$2,223,980. The 2026-2027-2028 Three-Year Investment Plan is available HERE:

2025 FOOD DRIVE RECAP

The Gore residents were once again, very generous this year. During the 2025 door-to-door food drive, dozens of volunteers collected over \$6,700 of donations in addition to non-perishable food items. An additional \$850 was also donated directly at the Community Centre and firefighters manning road stations collected over \$520. This sum is added to the \$765 raised last summer by the firefighters during Firefighters' Day. Furthermore, many generous donors sent their contributions directly to the Town Hall, all throughout the month of December, adding \$5,225 to the total amount collected.

In total, over \$14,060 in cash donations, along with an impressive quantity of non-perishable food items, were collected. A huge thank you to all the volunteers !

THE ÉCO-PRÊT PROGRAM - REMINDER

In 2023, the Municipality reinstated the Eco-Loan program to help residents replace their non-compliant or aging septic systems. The program is available to all homeowners within the Municipality's territory. Through this program, residents can obtain financial assistance in the form of a repayable loan to cover a portion of the costs associated with replacing their septic system. The amount of financial assistance granted is calculated based on the home's value (property value excluding land) and household income.

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GORE PUBLIC NOTICE

To those interested by the adoption of draft by-law No. 220-3
regarding the remuneration of elected municipal officers.

PUBLIC NOTICE is given as follows:

A notice of motion was given at the regular council meeting held on January 12, 2026, that by-law No. 220-3 will be proposed for adoption at the regular council meeting which will be held on March 2, 2026, at 7 p.m. at the Trinity community center situated at 2, Cambria Road in Gore.

Draft by-law No. 220-3 includes the following elements:

- The mayor's annual base remuneration is increased from \$37,532.64 in 2025 to \$38,771.00 in 2026.
- Each councillor's annual base remuneration is increased from \$9,512.16 in 2025 to \$10,512.16 in 2026.
- The base remuneration, as established by this by-law, will be indexed upward on January 1 of each fiscal year, starting with the year following this by-law's coming into effect.
- The amendment is retroactive to January 1, 2026.
- Members of a committee formed by resolution or by-law will receive \$50.00 for each meeting they attend.
- The acting mayor will receive remuneration equivalent to that of the mayor when replacing the mayor for more than 30 consecutive days.
- Each elected official will receive an expense allowance equal to half of their remuneration in accordance with the Act respecting the remuneration of elected municipal officers.
- The mayor will be entitled to a departure allowance after accumulating at least two years of credited service under the pension plan established pursuant to the Act respecting the pension plan of elected municipal officers (Chapter R-9.3).

Draft by-law No. 220-3 can be consulted on the municipality's website (www.cantondegore.qc.ca/en/publications/rules) or at the municipality's office located at 9 Cambria Road, Monday to Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Friday from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

There are a few projects scheduled this year at Lake Beattie Nature Park, one of which is the installation of the final forest cabin, completing the Cabins project for which we received a grant from the provincial government's PARIT (Tourism Industry Recovery Assistance Program). Developing trails in the northern part of the park, including the addition of a footbridge to cross Williams Creek downstream from the Jean Marchand Dam, is also a planned for 2026. This addition of approximately 8 km of trails will allow hikers to explore the magnificent and wild forest on the other side of Beattie Lake.

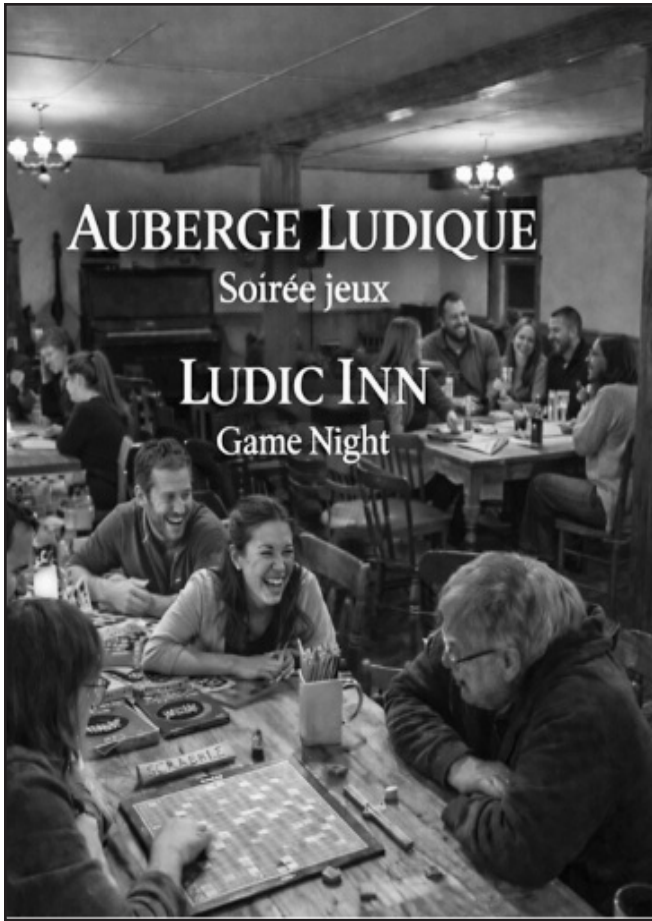

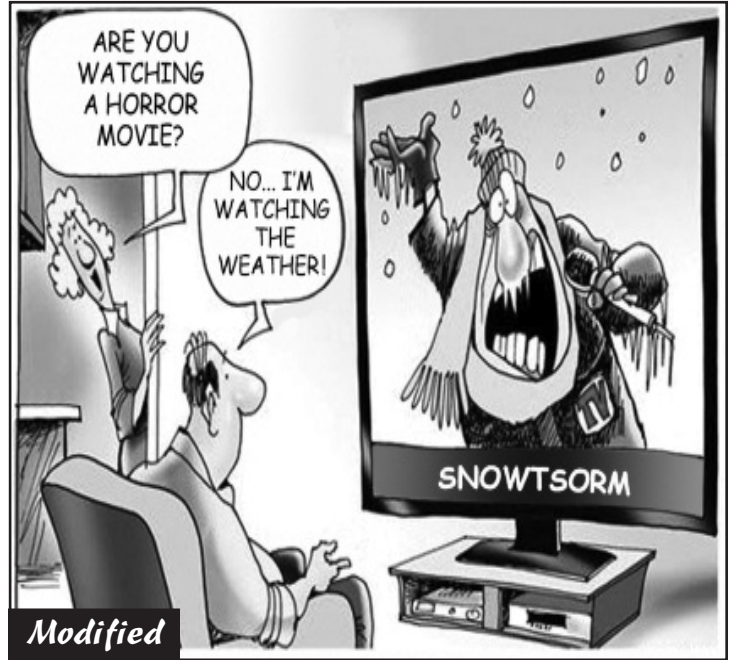
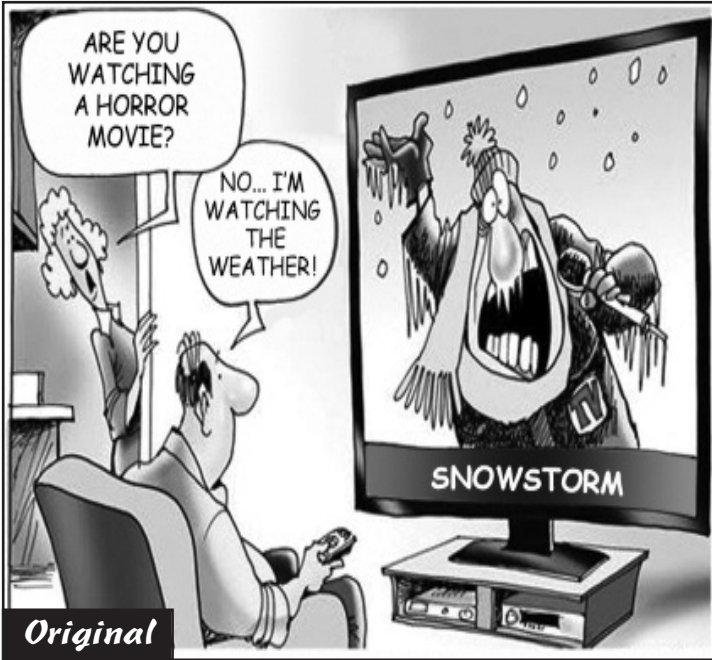
